
FOCUS ON: New England Cultural Nonprofits

As you know, CultureCount was created as a data warehouse for information gathered by NEFA on arts and culture nonprofits, individual artists, and creative businesses. Periodically, NEFA expands upon the data in CultureCount and commissions analysis to share with you, our users and colleagues. This time, we have collected and analyzed data on the four types of cultural nonprofits in New England: registered filer, registered non-filer, embedded, and unincorporated organizations. The financial information takes a while to be verified by the IRS and digitized by our partners at the National Center for Charitable Statistics (NCCS).
